keep it

After 23 monthly payments, the instrument would become yours with nothing further to pay.

- You select a trumpet which normally sells for **£149.00.**
- The first payment and subsequent monthly payments are only **£7.33.**
- After you have made 23 payments of £7.33, the instrument would belong to you with **nothing else to pay.**

swap it

If all is going well at any point after the minimum trial period, you want to **upgrade the instrument**, then the original instrument can be returned. We will then deduct **half of the value** of previous payments made from the price of the upgraded instrument!**

Say after 9 months you want to upgrade the trumpet to an instrument which normally sells for £299.00;

- You would have made 8 payments and a deposit of £7.33 = £65.97.
- You can then **deduct £32.99** off the price of the new instrument and you would only pay £261.01.
- This instrument can normally be put onto another finance scheme if you would rather **spread the payments.**

return it

However, the instrument can be returned after a minimum number of payments (usually 3 after deposit) and as long as it is in good condition, there is **nothing further to pay.**

Typical examples:

- **3/4 size guitars** from around £2.50 per month
- **Clarinets & flutes** from around £10 per month
- **Violins** from around £3.50 per month
- **Saxophones** from around £20 per month
- **Digital piano** from around £49 per month

* Windows trial scheme is financed using the finance provider, Moneyway. All finance agreements are subject to credit checks and other terms and conditions apply. On an instrument which sells for £149.00, the in-store deposit would be £7.33 paid by credit/debit card and if the instrument was kept for 23 months, then total amount paid would be £175.82 (APR 19.5%). However, the agreement can be cancelled after a minimum period (usually 3 direct debit payments). It must be returned to the store in good condition. Windows would then "re-purchase" the instrument and settle the outstanding finance amount on behalf of the customer. If the instrument was returned after 3 direct debit payments, total paid would be £29.32. Windows would settle the customer's finance agreement by paying £129.33 to Moneyway. The customer would have nothing else to pay. Total interest paid after 3 direct debit payments would be £1.17 x 3 = £3.51. Only selected instruments are available on the trial scheme. ** If upgrading after the minimum trial period, the maximum number of payments including deposit to offset against a new instrument is 12. Whilst almost all instruments do qualify for the upgrade programme, there are some exceptions. e.g. electronic pianos are not included. The upgrade instrument must also be at least twice the price of the RRP of the original instrument that was put on the trial scheme. Please ask a member of staff for details.
